Indigenous Peoples' Day is a holiday (in a few states) that honors Indigenous American peoples' histories and cultures. Our speaker, **Kameanani Blackman**, will touch on the history of Native Hawaiians, current challenges facing them, as well as Kameanani's personal experiences living in the diaspora. **Kameanani** is Kānaka 'Ōiwi (indigenous people of Hawaii) of mixed ancestry, a decolonial and scratchboard artist, natural science and fantasy illustrator, and on the Volusia Pride Board. Passions include research, justice, healing, and birding. **Ella Shephard** will be our service leader.

10/19/25 The Origins of Samhain

Samhain is the Gaelic festival marking the end of harvest season and the beginning of winter. Samhain is the basis of modern-day Halloween. Our speaker, **Rick de Yampert** is a freelance writer, sitar player, artist, and lecturer on sacred and metaphysical subjects. He has been following a Pagan spiritual path since the early 1990s. His book, *Crows and Ravens: Mystery, Myth, and Magic of Sacred Corvids,* was released by Llewellyn in March 2024. **Mara Whitridge** will be the service leader.

10/26/25 Ghosts, Zombies and Demons of Asia

Dr. Christopher Bell will take us for a spooky spin across the globe to ghosts in Tibet, China, and Japan. We'll explore Tibetan demons, Chinese zombies and fox spirits, and Japanese vengeance ghosts. An associate professor of religious studies at Stetson, he received his BA and MA from Florida State and his PhD from the Univ. of Virginia. In addition to teaching at Florida State and the Univ. of VA, he taught at the Hong Kong University of Science and Technology. Awarded a Fulbright Fellowship, he completed extensive research in China, Tibet, and India.
