There's a fear that we will be judged for our simple message of an open-minded search for truth, love, respect and justice—withOUT the need to require a belief in god. Learn about this progressive religion and learn how to explain and share it. **Jade Hoke-Smith**, VP of UU DeLand and Programming Chair, will read a sermon by **Rev. Kaaren Solveig Anderson**, who serves as the interim minister for First Parish Brewster UU. Having served UU congregations throughout NY, MA, and FL for over 25 years, she recently served as the Interim Minister of the UU Fellowship in Vero Beach. Rev. Kaaren received her Master of Divinity from Union Theological Seminary/Columbia University. She is also an artist and a published author of several meditations and essays.

#### 9/14/25 Combat Stress with Outdoor Recreation Therapy

With the decline of physical and mental health, people are in a crisis of purpose and meaning. Technology and divisive politics are leading to isolation and turning us against each other. How do we find peace and belonging in this age of chaos and polarization? Learn how to combat these problems through hands-on outdoor recreation therapy, including martial arts, archery, woodworking, blacksmithing and time around a fire. With an emphasis on building social and emotional intelligence, learn how you can build confidence, discipline and strength—both physical and mental. **Kayan Cajudo** is the founder of Cypress River Outdoor Education, a registered nonprofit 501(c)(3). Having taught Filipino martial arts for 25+ years, he also teaches outdoor skills like archery, wood carving, blacksmithing, and physical fitness.

## 9/28/25 How Mysticism can Help us Recover from Spiritual Trauma

Learn how people throughout the world, and over the millennia, connect directly with the divine through contemplation and meditation. Unfortunately, religious fundamentalism can be a root contributor to much spiritual trauma. Using teachings from Rumi, Thomas Merton, Thich Nhat Hanh and Jane Fonda, **Bill Brennan**, L.M.H.C., C.A.P., will explain how Mysticism can help us recover from spiritual trauma and offer ancient practices to open us up to the beauty of a direct mystical experience. A psychotherapist for 37 years and a certified addiction professional, Bill has worked with dual-diagnosed clients on inpatient and outpatient levels. He uses EMDR (Eye Movement Desensitization and Reprocessing) and hypnotherapy to help people recover from trauma, depression, anxiety, addiction, and narcissistic abuse. He provides a therapeutic context sensitive to the spiritual needs of each individual. He is also a trained spiritual director and life coach.
